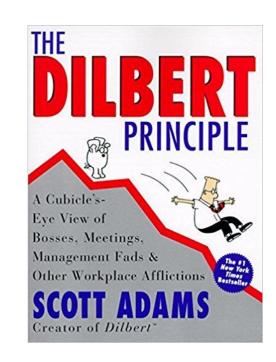


#1 Learn from Mistakes

#2 Business is like a Marriage

Unfortunately, lots of them fail

Pick your partners carefully

Expect the need for tie breakers



#3 Agendas

No agenda-less meetings

Pick a set date and time

Keep & Review Minutes

Assign, Record & Review Action Items



#4 Use Mailing Lists (correctly)

Mailing Lists / Forums / Groups are great for planning and records

Can be a "cold" method with no feedback

Can be inefficient

Avoid burnout by sharing/delegating
